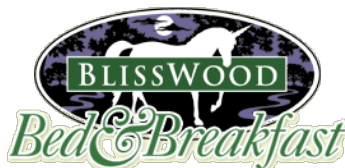

Coloring Contest, Grades K-5th Rules

- The subject of your work will be the **Attwater’s Prairie-Chicken, its prairie habitat, or other coastal prairie species**. More information on this unique bird and its habitat may be found on our website at www.Attwater.org or on the attached page.
- All artwork must be chosen from one of the four 8 1/2 x 11 line drawings attached. The student's work must be **original, individual and hand-done**.
- Acceptable art medium is crayon only.
- All artwork must be 8.5" x 11" without a mat, frame or border.
- **No lettering, signatures, or initials may appear on the front of the design**. Any artwork with such identifying characteristics will be disqualified and eliminated from the competition.
- **Use a clear glue stick to affix your completed entry form to the back of the artwork**. PLEASE ... do not fold, staple, paper clip or tape....it damages the artwork!
- All artwork must be turned in to your school’s Art Teacher by **February 1, 2016**. Artwork must be completely dry by the time the artwork is turned in for judging.
- The artwork judging criteria will be **50% creativity/originality and 50% technical skill**.
- All artwork becomes the property of the Friends of Attwater Prairie Chicken Refuge and will NOT be returned to the artist.
- 1st place will receive a \$50.00 prize and plaque, 2nd place will receive a \$25.00 prize and ribbon, and 3rd place will receive a \$10.00 prize and ribbon.

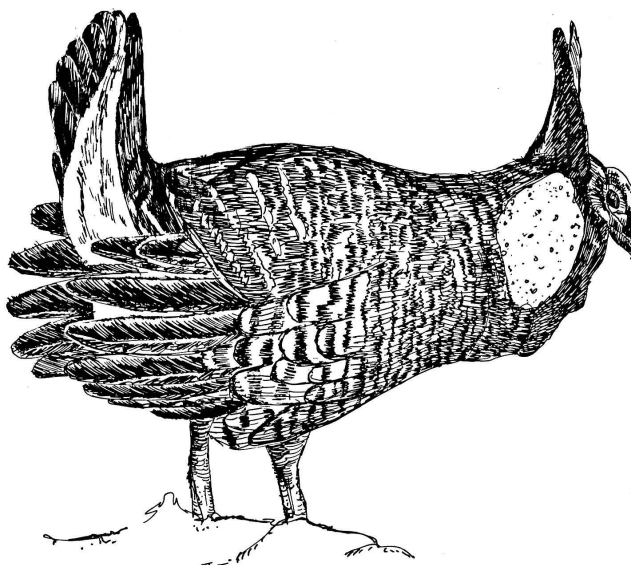

Meet the Attwater's Prairie-Chicken

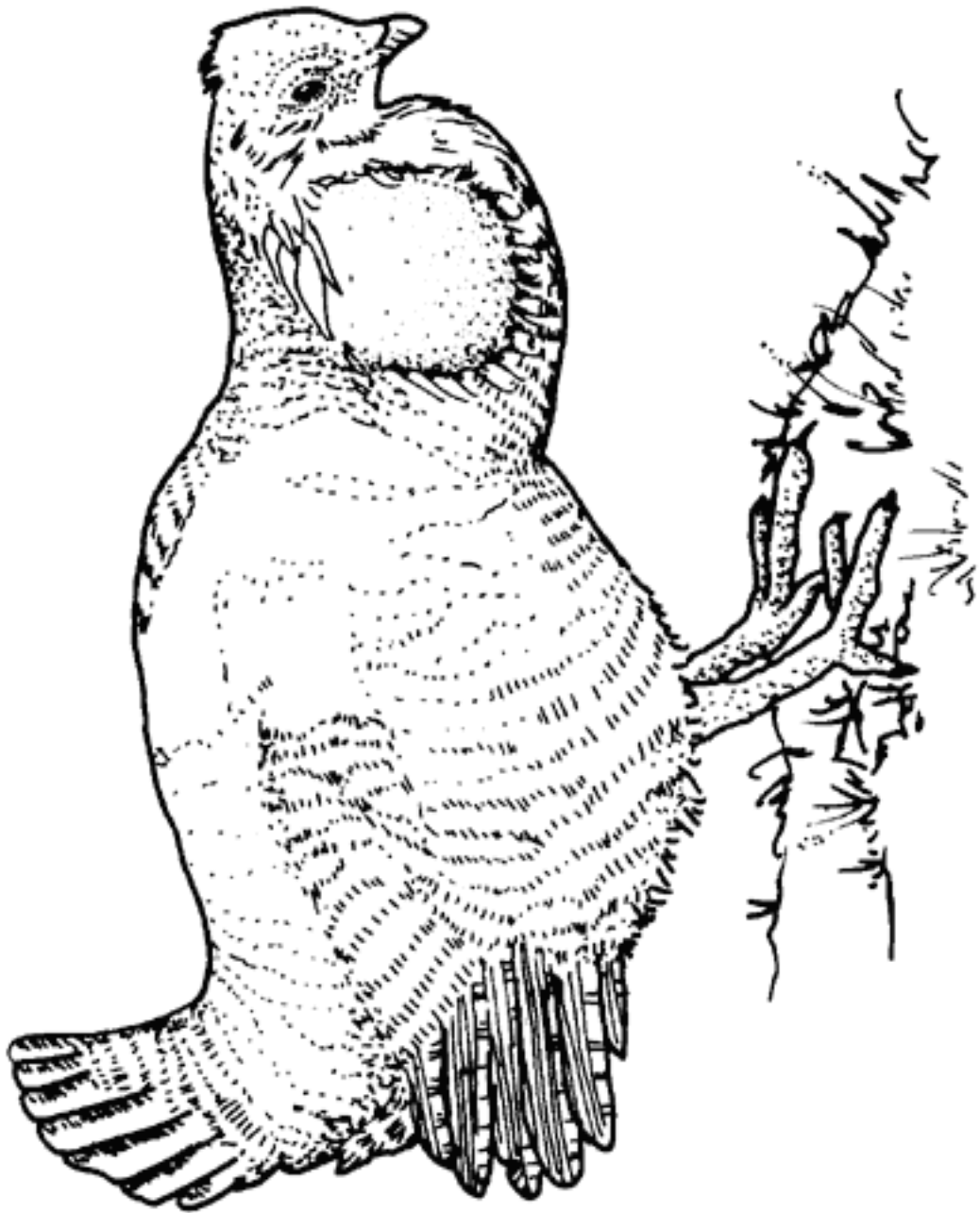
The Attwater Prairie Chicken National Wildlife Refuge, www.fws.gov/refuge/AttwaterPrairieChicken is located approximately 60 miles west of Houston, Texas, is one of the largest remnants of coastal prairie habitat remaining in southeast Texas and home to one of the last populations of the critically endangered Attwater's prairie chicken, a ground-dwelling grouse of the coastal prairie ecosystem. The refuge is one of a handful of national wildlife refuges managed specifically for an endangered species and was created to preserve prairie habitat specifically for the preservation of this unique species. The Attwater's Prairie Chicken is a unique subspecies of the Greater Prairie-Chicken (*Tympanuchus cupido*) a member of the Grouse Family. The Attwater's subspecies is found on the coastal Texas Prairies (now in danger of extinction), is smaller and darker (length = 17", wing-span 28") *. During the spring the Prairie Chickens can be found on an area of the prairie known as the leks. The males display by strutting and dancing and filling their yellow-orange air sacks located on their necks. When expelling the air a low hooting sound much like blowing across a bottle, is heard known as "Booming."
